Populus qui habitat in tenebris, vidit lucem magnam

Dear Friends:

The people who live in darkness have seen a great light and those who dwell in endless gloom a light has shown. At this time we may seem to live in darkness with the world being turned upside-down. We do not know the future and it frightens us. I have talked to a number of my friends and they are in terror. In my own brokenness I could not give them the comfort that they desperately need. Like many of you I feel like I am in darkness with no one to whom I can go to for peace. Our journey is a bleak and lifeless walk into more darkness. However, the Prophet Isiah tells us to

climb the LORD's mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may instruct us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths. "For from Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem.

It is from the holy mountain of God, where he instructs us, that we are given to the tools to change the path of our journey to move into the light of faith. Until that time when the Lord returns we are to be the bearers of the light and be the bearers of the Word that does dwell among us.

My dearest friends, I entreat you to trust in the good things that God has in store for us. Let us not stay in darkness, but be the people of light. God is with us and he will always be with us. Let us wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ and the peace that he brings!
